University: University of Colorado

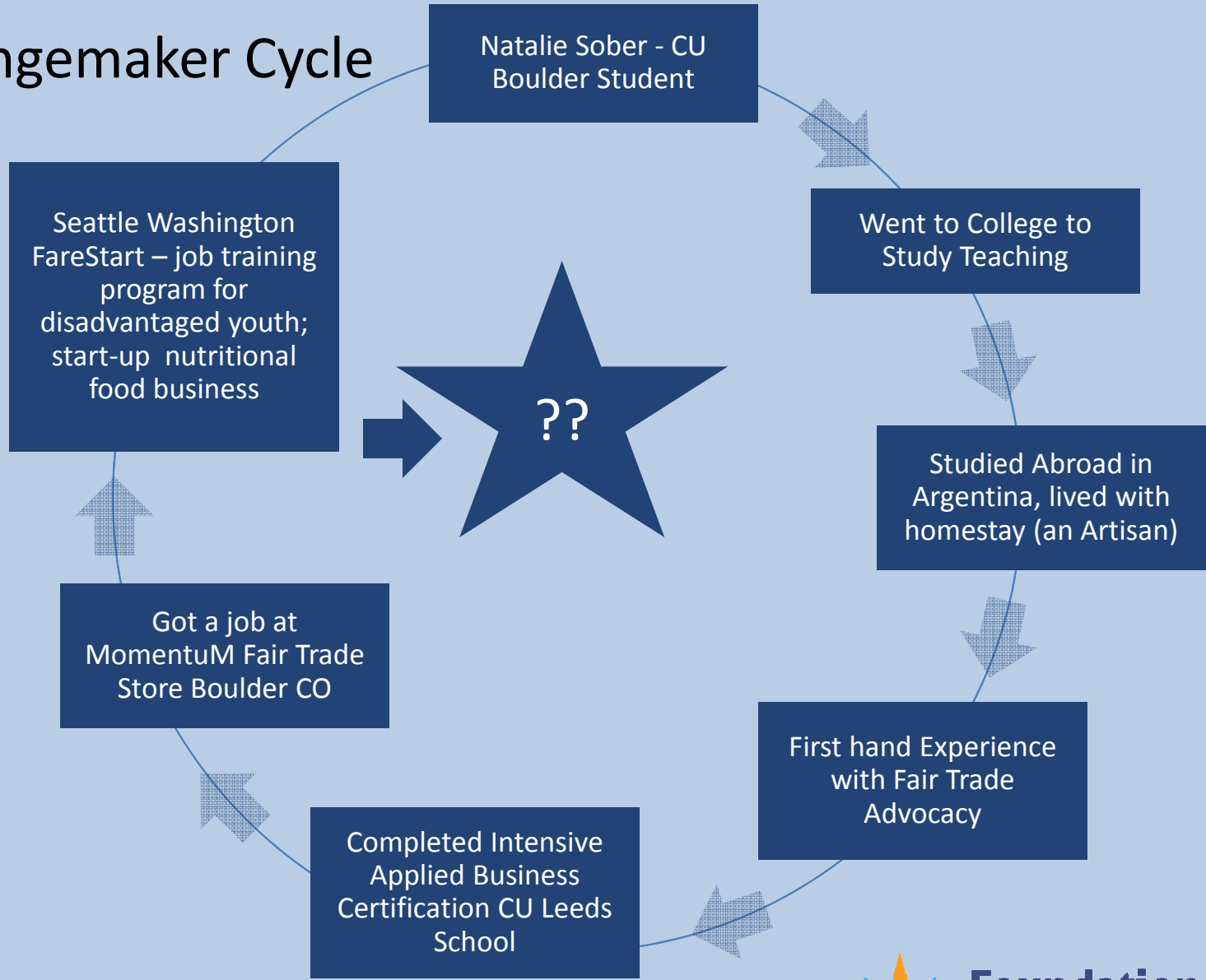
Major: Spanish and Elementary Education

Changemaker Cycle





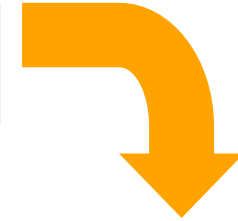
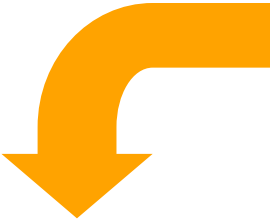

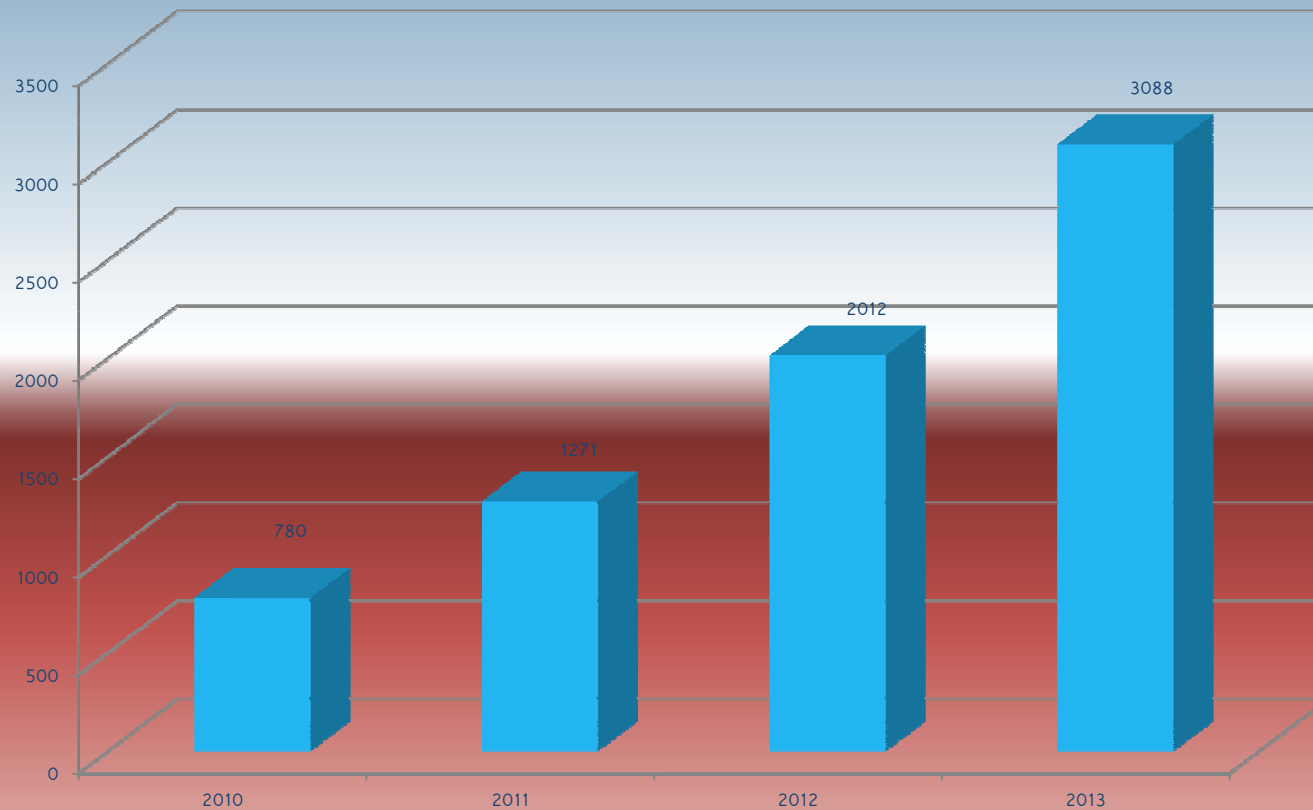

The FGS Mentoring Philosophy



- We focus on students who have studied abroad or who have some significant international experience
- We focus on companies who need quality graduates and who have international interests not on making academic matches
- We believe our mentoring program is a service to both the student and the mentor

What is Speed Mentoring?

- Students and companies commit to 2 hours one day during the school year typically in the afternoon 4-6pm.
- Students and company representative meet sit across from each other for 10-15 minutes at tables in one room. Cards exchanged.
- When the bell sounds you move
- Students must register – no cost
- Mentors must commit to attend or find a substitute on the day

Why does it work?

Held on college campuses

Students meet 10-15 leaders from organizations

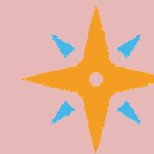
Mentors have been fairly easy to find

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The Event Process



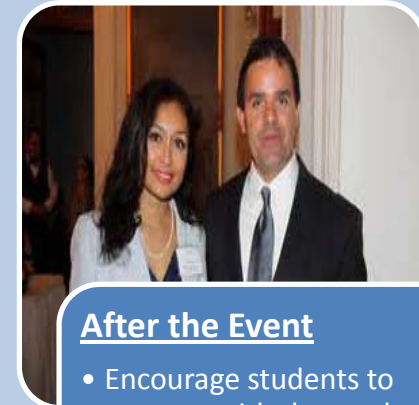
4 months prior
